A mini-session from early career researchers with useful info for postgrads at all stages of candidature. The panel will briefly cover the spectrum of 'new' statistics and methods, including where the best sources of information on these methods are.

The number of methods we can use to collect and analyse psychological data has exploded over the last decade. For graduate students, this means that your advisor(s) may not always be familiar with the best technique to analyse your data. We'll focus on the most effective strategies to use available information to bootstrap your statistical knowledge when you don't have a teacher, as well as dealing with how to sell new techniques to your advisors, and how to proceed when there's no-one around who can check your work. At the end of the session, we'll expand our scope to discuss how to grapple with the open science movement as graduate students, including preregistration, open data, and the '21-word solution'.
